Barbara Reid O.P on Monday, 28 June at 2:00pm – 3:30pm IST

Barbara E. Reid, O.P. is a Dominican Sister of Grand Rapids, Michigan and holds a Ph.D. in Biblical Studies from The Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C. She is President of Catholic Theological Union and Carroll Stuhlmueller, CP Distinguished Professor of New Testament Studies. She has taught at CTU since 1988 and served as Vice President and Academic Dean from 2009-2018. She has led many study tours and retreats in the Holy Lands. Barbara is author of twelve books and numerous articles, most recently the two-volume commentary on the Gospel of Luke that she co-authored with Prof. Shelly Matthews in the Wisdom Commentary series (wisdomcommentary.org), for which she is also General Editor.



Ivone Gebara on Thursday, 8 July at 2:00pm – 3:30pm IST

Ivone Gebara, is a Brazilian Sister of the Congregation of Our Lady, Canonesses of St. Augustine and Doctor of Philosophy and Religious Sciences. She is Professor Emeritus of the Institute of Theology of Recife, consultant of popular groups in the ecofeminist perspective and author of books and articles published in many different languages.



Miriam MacGillis on Wednesday, 14 July at 2:00pm – 3:30pm IST

Miriam MacGillis is the Co-founder and present Interim Coordinator of Genesis Farm, a ministry sponsored by the Sisters of St. Dominic, of Caldwell, NJ.

Miriam has a Masters Degree in Fine Arts from the University of Notre Dame. For the past forty years, she has evolved the mission of Genesis Farm drawn from the writings of cultural historian, Thomas Berry and mathematical cosmologist Brian Swimme. Miriam's work has been grounded in her particular bioregion in the greater Delaware and Hudson Rivers water-basin on the eastern edge of the north American continent. She has also lectured nationally and internationally on the evolution of the Universe and the need to create a functional cosmology.
